



Answers to Questions You, Your Employees and Your Customers May Have.

Q How long will this part of the project take?

Since the project started, the goal has been to have the Massillon Road North Corridor Improvement Project mostly completed by the end of 2021. Some restoration (landscaping) may extend into the Spring of 2022. After nearly a year of construction, the project is on schedule, and as weather cooperates, we will complete the project on schedule. This multiphased project includes constructing three roundabouts, widening the road to four lanes with a center median and adding a multipurpose trail on the west side of the road and a traditional sidewalk on the east side.

Q How will access to and from my business be affected?

Whether your business is along the corridor or along SR 619 near the new roundabout site, the way people access your location may change during construction. Plans ensure that customers and employees can get to places of business at all times. All businesses will have access and egress, though this may be modified depending on the type of work being done. For example, steel plates may be used to maintain access during construction. All businesses will be notified of any changes to their access points throughout construction. In addition, signage will be added as needed to assist motorists with accessing businesses.

Q Why is the project necessary?

Currently the corridor is perhaps our most congested road in the City and isn't equipped for the growth in traffic to come in the years and decades ahead. The added lanes ensure the corridor can handle the additional vehicles, which are expected to grow on a per-day basis from 21,000 to an estimated 41,000 by 2035, per an AMATS Traffic Study estimate.

Heavy traffic and obscured sightlines made it difficult to make left turns within the corridor. The updated traffic patterns that emerge from the roundabouts and improved sightlines at Raber Road, Stein Road and SR 619 will make the corridor more efficient and safer for motorists. The roundabout at SR 619 helps modulate traffic into and out of the corridor from the North. Instead of waiting at traffic lights, motorists will be able to keep moving through busy intersections.

Q Will there be road closures?

The east and west legs of SR 619 at the Massillon Road intersection will be closed over the next few months. While exact dates haven't been set, the east leg will be closed for 60 days starting in May, while the west leg will be closed for 30 days in July. At no time will the legs be closed at the same time.
