The City of Green, Ohio is prosperous, progressive and promising – three distinctive attributes that residents and business alike can embrace. Green is geographically desirable, business-savvy and family-oriented.



Geographically Desirable

The City of Green is located equidistant between Akron and Canton, in southern Summit County. Our location provides those who live and work here easy access to Cleveland, Akron, Canton and points south. Drivers can reach the shores of Lake Erie within 60-minutes and are within a one-day drive of more than 50 percent of the U.S. population. The City of Green offers one of the best locations for businesses and families to live, work and play in Northeast Ohio.



Convenient Access to Air Travel

One of the nation's fastest growing airports, Akron-Canton Airport, is located within the City of Green, making air travel convenient. More than 1.5 million passengers pass through its gates annually.



Over the last several years the airport has seen a growth in both the number of passengers traveling through the airport, and also an increase in the number of destinations reached. Currently, the airport offers direct service to Atlanta, Boston, Charlotte, Chicago (ODR), Denver, Detroit, Ft. Lauderdale, Ft. Meyers, Milwaukee, New York City, Orlando, Philadelphia, Tampa and Washington, DC (DCA).

CAK travelers have access to services provided by AirTran (now part of Southwest Airlines), Frontier, United, Delta and US Airways.

Well-Situated Access to Highways

Green is bisected by I-77, the major north-south interstate connecting Cleveland, Akron, Canton and communities south. All business locations and residential homes are within three-miles of direct access to I-77. From

I-77 North, Green is approximately 10 miles to I-76 and 20 miles to I-80. Two major State Routes, SR 241 (Massillon Road), which runs north and south and SR 619 (East Turkeyfoot Lake Road), which runs east and west, also service the city.

Business Savvy

World-Class Neighbors

Green is home to more than 1,100 businesses – both large and small – including FedEx Custom Critical, Diebold, Harry London's Candies, Akron-Canton Airport, InfoCision Management, ASC Industries and many more.



First-Rate Business Parks

Green is home to 10 industrial and business parks, all with convenient access to I-77. CAK International Business Park also includes a Foreign Trade Zone, allowing some businesses that choose to locate there the ability to act as if they are outside the US for taxing purposes. The city continues to enhance these business hubs through its business-friendly attitude and desire to attract and grow companies.



Excellent Quality of Life

With strong schools, abundant park land, and fun recreation programs for kids to seniors, Green is more than a great place to raise a family, it's a great place to live whatever your stage of life.

Excellent Schools

The Green Local School District has held an "excellent" rating since 1999 and rated the No. 1 school district in Summit County and in the top 4 percent in the state of Ohio. Within close proximity of Green are several universities including The University of Akron, Kent State University, Walsh University, University of Mount Union, Stark State College and Malone University. The metro area is home to Case Western Reserve University, John Carroll University, College of Wooster, Cleveland Institute of Art & Design, just to name a few.



First-Class Healthcare

Those working and living in Green have access to top-notch health care through Akron Children's, Akron General and Summa health systems.

Low Cost of Living

Living in the Akron/Canton area allows families to buy more house and goods with less money. The Cost of Living in the area is generally below that of many other cities, allowing Northeast Ohio to stay competitive. For example, the cost of living in Green is 23.6 percent lower than Chicago, IL;



Abundant Park Land

The City of Green boasts more than 524-acres of park land in 10 parks and is home to five golf courses and the Portage Lakes State Park. The Portage Lakes State Park provides access to 2,000 acres of fresh water used for recreational purposes. Green is within close proximity to the Cuyahoga Valley National Park; the Ohio and Erie Canal Towpath Trail; and the Metro Parks serving Summit County, making outdoor activities and recreation a way of life in our area.
