A RESOLUTION ACCEPTING THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE TAX INCENTIVE REVIEW COUNCIL (“TIRC”) REGARDING THE ENTERPRISE ZONE, THE COMMUNITY REINVESTMENTS AREA, AND TAX INCREMENT FINANCING AGREEMENTS WITHIN THE CITY OF GREEN, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code §5709.85 requires a City that enters into a Enterprise Zone Agreement, a Tax Increment Financing Agreement, or a Community Reinvestments Area Agreement, to appoint a Tax Incentive Review Council (“TIRC”) to review each agreement, to review each business’s compliance with each agreement, and to make a recommendation to continue, modify, or terminate each agreement; and

WHEREAS, the duly appointed TIRC met on June 5, 2014 to review the Enterprise Zone Agreements, Tax Increment Financing Agreements and Community Reinvestment Area Agreements, reviewed each business’s compliance with each Agreement, and made certain recommendations to either continue, modify, or terminate each Agreement; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ohio Revised Code §5709.85, the Council of the City of Green is required to either accept, reject, or modify all or any portion of the recommendations of the TIRC within Sixty (60) days.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GREEN, COUNTY OF SUMMIT, AND STATE OF OHIO, THAT:
